


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SAN DIEGO BANGLA SCHOOL

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ENROLLING STUDENTS NOW!

Description:

- Cater lessons for students who are at the beginning level of Bangla literacy
- Useful to students of ages 4 to 18 as well as adults who have some awareness of Bangla culture
- Based on initial assessment, each child will be placed in a group that is appropriate for the student. Teachers will provide individualized teaching as appropriate.

- College level/Adult students are requested to email first to ensure that the materials presented in this course will be suitable to their intellectual curiosity.

Teaching Method:

- Primary language of instruction is a blend of Bangla and English.
- Alphabets are introduced to students by utilizing the Bangladesh Rural Advancement Committee (BRAC) method so students are quickly able to write and read words and small sentences using a selected list of alphabets based on their phonetics. This method also accelerates the pace of reading and writing.
- Students are required to use weekly conversation logs and reading logs to report their reading and spoken language progress

Learning Objectives:

Depending on age/group, all or a portion of these learning objectives will be covered:

1. **Increase appreciation** of Bangla language and culture through group activities
2. **Learn** vocabulary used in daily life to assist in speaking.
3. **Recognize and write** Bangla alphabets
4. **Read and Write** basic words and small sentences showing mastery of the alphabets.
5. **Identify and recite** Bangla numbers **Identify** colors, shapes, days of the week, and seasons.
6. **Familiarize** with the regional map and locations of major cities and rivers, flag and other related topics through social studies lecture series. Parents are welcome to suggest such topics.
7. **Research** a pre-assigned topic that relates to Bangla culture and heritage. **Present the research** topic in front of class.

Tuition and Timeline:

- Regular Student: \$100 per Session. Session meets for 8 classes. Summer session meets once every week and Fall/Spring once in two weeks.
- Intermittent Student: \$20 per day. Student may pick and choose classes to attend. Additional take home supplemental materials are available for a nominal cost.
- Each class session starts on Sundays 2:45 PM and ends by 5:15 PM. Please contact for posted schedule.
